

THE BRIGHTMAN AWARD

An important factor in Phi Gamma Delta's success over the years has been our constantly increasing and effective graduate support. Graduate interest and service has contributed much toward quality perpetuation of our Fraternity.

To adequately recognize this important facet of our operation, the Horace I. Brightman Award was established.

The **Brightman Award** for the graduate chapter that best evidences how Phi Gamma Delta is "Not For College Days Alone" was made possible through the generosity of **C. Edward Miller (Columbia 1924)** of Los Angeles, CA, in honor of **Horace Brightman (Columbia 1892)**, the Fraternity's tenth president. The graduate chapter competitions are divided into two categories: those chapters having more than 75 members and those having less than 75.

One graduate chapter (regardless of size) will also be recognized in each of the following categories:

- **Recruitment & Outreach:** Recognizes the graduate chapter which excels in communicating to and engaging local graduate brothers.
- **Programming:** Recognizes the graduate chapter with the most active and diverse calendar of events which engages a wide variety of graduates with different interests.
- **Undergraduate Support:** Recognizes the graduate chapter which best assists area undergraduates, strengthening their Phi Gamma Delta experience and promoting the advantages of involvement after graduation.
- **Community Outreach & Involvement:** Recognizes the graduate chapter which best demonstrates community service and involvement through its members and activities.
- **New Chapter of the Year:** Recognizes the outstanding graduate chapter which was formed/reconstituted within the previous calendar year.
