



# Phi Gamma Delta Volunteer Opportunities

## Section Chief

The Section Chief is an Appointed General Officer, who is the primary recruiter for graduate volunteers within Phi Gamma Delta's geographical sections. The Section Chief ensures each chapter has an active trained and productive Purple Legionnaire, Board of Chapter Advisors and House Corporation.

He is recommended by the Section Chief Executive Committee and is appointed by the Archons.

### Objectives and Responsibilities

- Recruitment of Purple Legionnaires – A Section Chief is responsible for identifying and recruiting Purple Legionnaires for each of his chapters as needed.
- Recruitment of Graduate Volunteers – A Section Chief is expected to assist each of his chapters in ensuring that the graduate support groups (BCA and HC) have enough Graduate Brothers to properly function.
- Work with Fraternity staff to establish graduate chapters in cities which warrant such activity that does not currently exist.
- Provide support and guidance for Purple Legionnaires, Board of Chapter Advisors, House Corporations, and Graduate Associations and Graduate Chapters.
- Attendance at Fraternity Events – The Section Chief is expected to represent his section at the annual Fiji Academy and biannual Ekklesia;
- Visit each chapter annually and attend his chapters' Pig Dinners where practical.
- Be a knowledgeable resource for his chapters and advisors in Fraternity law and policies
- Submit annual reports on the status of his section / chapters.
- Submit an annual Wilkinson Award nominee from the section
- Where practical, organize an annual state day / section gathering to further the leadership development of undergraduates in the section.
- Assist Fraternity staff in identifying and executing expansion and colonization opportunities.

### Preferred Perquisites and Attributes

- Graduated at least five years prior to appointment
- Served in prior undergraduate leadership and/or graduate advisory roles
- Sufficient time available to commit to the Section Chief role while maintaining a good work-life-Fraternity balance
- Solid speaking and written communication skills
- Self-motivating and able to motivate others as needed
- Ability to move beyond their local chapter and work effectively at a regional level with all chapters
- Ability to assess a situation quickly and act rationally and without undue emotion or personal drama
